AS OUR MISSION READS...To permanently protect the fertile soils, rangelands, open space, and biological resources and to support a viable agricultural economy in the Tri-Valley area.

BOD, staff, and volunteers use our mission to guide their discussions, decisions, and direction when implementing a program or service to our community. In recent years TVC has focused its energies to:

- BECOME A RESPECTED AND EFFECTIVE VOICE IN THE PRESERVATION OF OPEN SPACES, AGRICULTURAL LAND, AND NATURAL RESOURCES
- ESTABLISH A STRONG GRASSROOTS NETWORK WITH LOCAL AND COUNTY LEADERSHIP AND PARTNERSHIPS WITH COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS
- PROVIDE RESOURCES FOR DEVELOPING STRATEGIES TO ASSIST LANDOWNERS TO BECOME MORE EFFECTIVE AND BETTER STEWARDS OF THEIR LAND

Our mission led us to efforts that helped to make 2014 a great year for land conservation in the Tri-Valley. We were successful in:

PROTECTING DOOLAN CANYON FROM DEVELOPMENT—Doolan

Canyon lies between Dublin and the North Livermore Valley. It was threatened by an out-of-town developer's plan to build 1900 units in the canyon. TVC provided the resources and partnered with several environmental and community organizations to educate the residents of Dublin about the problems with this development. Results were a 5 to 0 vote by the Dublin City Council to establish an urban growth boundary and an 84% to 16% vote by residents against ballot measure T: The development proposal was strongly rejected.

ADDING 74 ACRES TO SYCAMORE GROVE PARK—Since 2009.

TVC has owned 74 acres of land in Sycamore Grove Park. It has taken years to process the transfer of the land to the Livermore Area Recreation and Park District [LARPD]. At the end of 2014, the final paperwork was signed and LARPD became the new owner, with TVC continuing to hold the conservation easement. The new park land creates a continuous open space consisting of Sycamore Grove Park, Camp Arroyo, and Del Valle Regional Park.

ACQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND WILDLIFE APPROVAL TO HOLD WILDLIFE HABITAT EASEMENTS—TVC has a strong

interest in preserving open space and natural resources throughout the Tri-Valley. One of the best ways for us to accomplish this goal is to hold and manage wildlife habitat easements. A six-month process included a lengthy application, interviews, and the establishment of policy and procedures. In the fall of 2014 TVC received a letter stating that our application had been approved.

While our daily work is guided by our mission, none of our accomplishments would have been possible without the friendship and backing that comes from our supporters, community, and volunteers. Thank you! We look forward to taking on more challenges and turning them into successes, to make the Tri-Valley area an even more beautiful and enjoyable place in which to live and work.
