



Volunteer Description

You can help ensure our protected lands are being preserved by joining us on our annual Stewardship Visits. At its simplest, land stewardship means managing property. For Tri-Valley Conservancy, stewardship means visiting the beautiful properties held under conservation easements to ensure that the land's precious resources are being protected.

With help from volunteers like you, Tri-Valley Conservancy monitors over 100 preserved properties in the Livermore area. Each property is different and some require more walking than others. If you're not comfortable walking hills, or if you have other physical limitations, please let us know and we'll do our best to accommodate you.

Time

Stewardship Visits take place weekdays and typically occur in the spring and summer. We try to visit 3-5 properties at a time, which takes 2-3 hours depending on property size. Most volunteers join us for visits once or twice a year.

Schedule

In order to best accommodate your schedule, please send Carolyn, our Land Conservation Associate, your approximate availability. (Examples: Monday mornings, Thursdays after May, my schedule varies, I'm usually available, etc.) As visits are scheduled during the next several months, Carolyn will email you about 2-3 weeks before the visits, to check your availability for specific dates and times.
